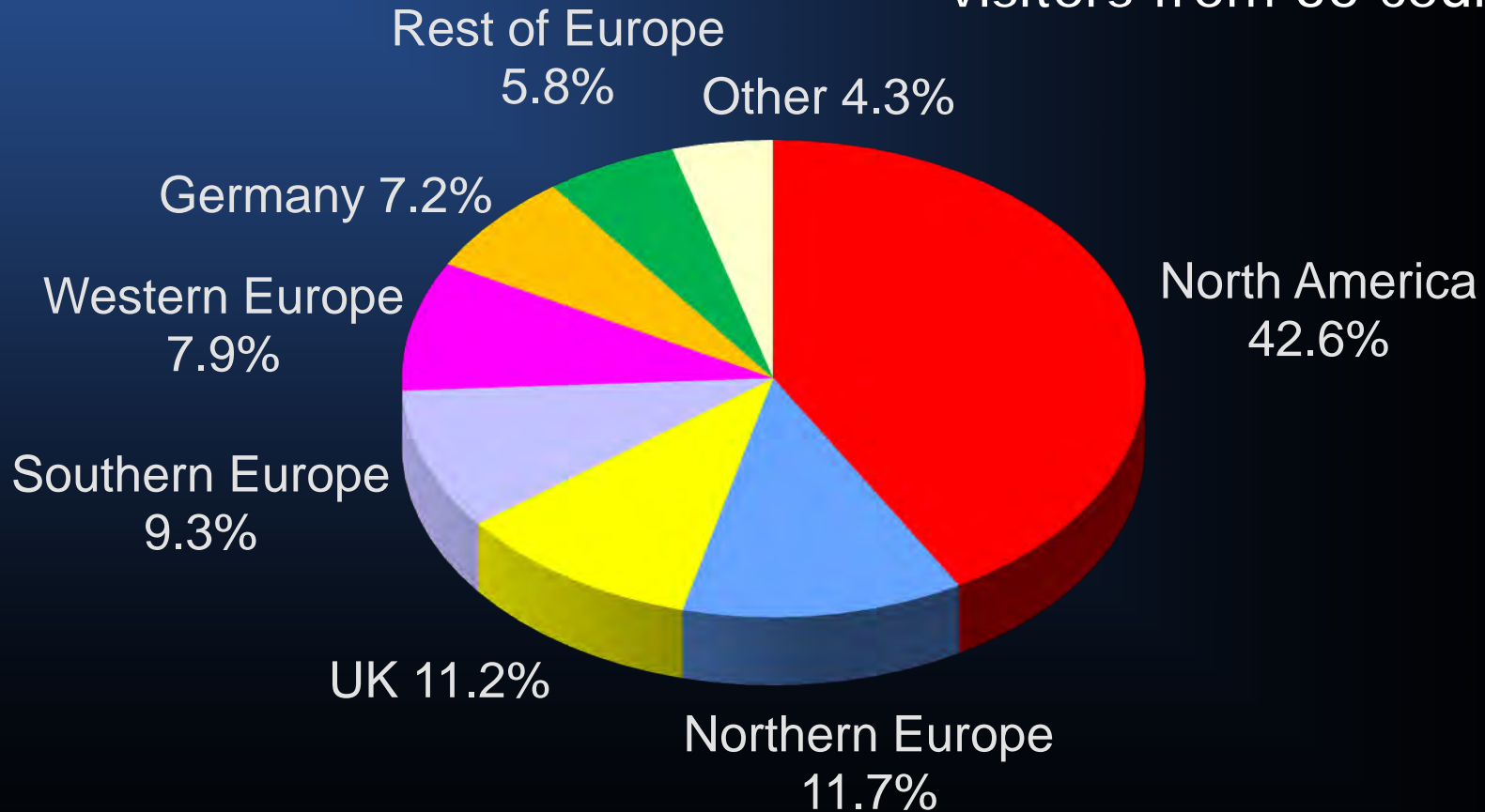

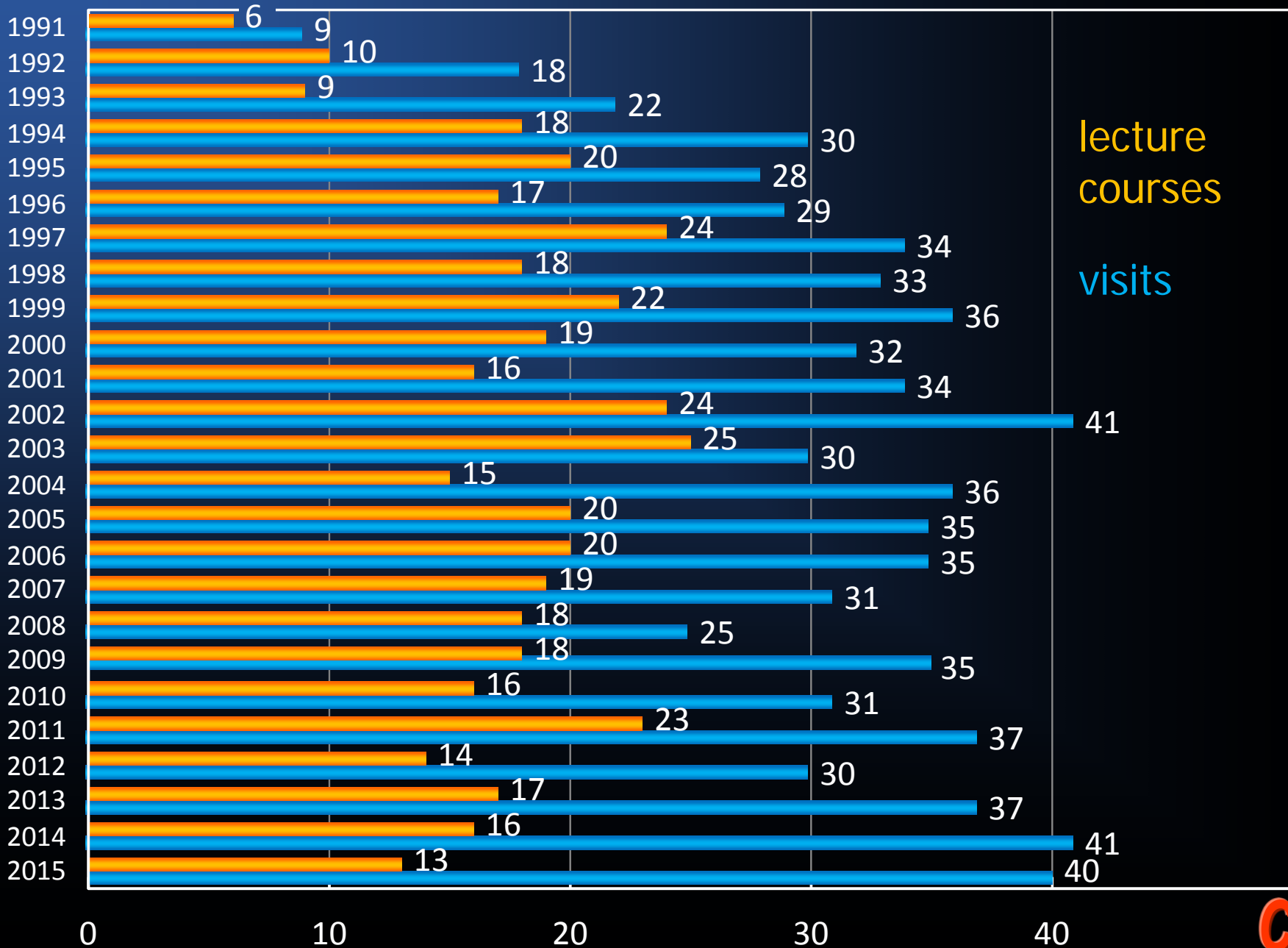

A Start Has Been Made Ein Anfang

The Center for Economic Studies, CES, for short, has now been formally approved by the Bavarian Ministry for Science and Art after three years of consideration, discussion and actual preparation. It was established as an independent institute within the University of Munich, Faculty of Economics, on 18th January 1991 and is headed by Hans-Werner Sinn, a full professor in the faculty.

The idea first came up in 1988 during negotiations following the offer of an appointment abroad. The plans for the institute gradually became more concrete, basic funds have now been allocated and a secretary has been set up. CES is housed temporarily with the Seminar for Insurance Science (Seminar für Versicherungs-wissenschaft) at Ludwigstr. 33. However, in early Summer 1992 both CES and the Seminar will be able to move to more spacious accommodation at Schackstr. 4. The university administration has ensured that sufficient space will be available in the interim period.

The main aim of CES is to bring together, at the Munich Faculty of Economics, scholars from all over the world. These visitors will be invited to give papers and lectures at CES and to undertake research there. Rooms will be available for visitors who wish to spend a sabbatical in Munich, and visiting professor and lectureships can be offered for shorter periods of between a few weeks and a few months.

CES will also organize conferences and workshops in Munich when finance permits. Arrangements have already been made for CES to work with the National Bureau of Economic Research (Cambridge/Mass.) and the London School of Economics in organizing the 1992 TAPE seminars (Trans Atlantic Public Economics).

It is especially important that in the newly founded International Meeting Center (IMZ) of Munich's universities guest apartments have been made available to CES. The Bayerische Rückversicherung is also helping in providing accommodation in order to alleviate the drastic shortage of apartments. This support is very much appreciated.

theoretical economists, whose work is rigorously mathematical, and economists interested in policy issues, whose methods are literary and statistical.

CES aims to help close the gap between the two approaches by using theoretical instruments to deal with questions relating to economic policy issues.

An advisory council made up of leading economic scientists of international repute has been established. It is available not only for consultation and advice, but will also help in making contact with scholars who could be invited to visit CES. Its members include three presidents of the European Economic Association, a leading American economist and members of the Munich economics faculty. Two emeritus professors of the faculty are honorary members, as is Richard Musgrave, the world expert in international finance. Professor Musgrave studied in Munich before he emigrated to America and is now renewing his contacts with his Alma Mater through CES.

Despite the present still very provisional working conditions of CES, an attractive program has already been planned.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARIES

On 18 January, 1991 the legal foundation of the Center for Economic Studies (CES) was formally confirmed by the Bavarian Ministry of Education. This confirmation launched the building of a remarkable international guest programme which, since then, has attracted more than 250 visitors and has significantly increased the integration of the Munich economics department into the international scientific community.

To mark the occasion of its tenth anniversary CES, in co-operation with CESifo, will hold a conference on *Public Finances and Public Policy in the New Millennium* from 12-13 January, 2001. The conference will bring together a group of researchers who have visited CES during the last ten years and who together will present an array of scholarly views on various economic policy problems that will continue to haunt societies and treasuries in the new millennium. Special attention will be given to the topics "Privatisation of public activities", "Systems competition" and "Public finance requirements for an integrating Europe".

The celebration of CES's anniversary also commemorates another, much more extraordinary anniversary. Richard A. Musgrave, the founder of modern Public Economics and a CES council member right from its beginning, will celebrate his 90th birthday on 14 December, 2000. To honour this special occasion, the conference volume that will grow out of the event will be dedicated to Professor Musgrave

MANAGERIAL

Stefan Reichelstein, currently Michael N. Chekhov Professor of Accounting in the Haas School of Business at U.C. Berkeley, will be visiting CES in December. He received his Ph.D. from Northwestern University and was previously on the faculty at Stanford University and the University of Vienna.

Reichelstein's research interest focuses on managerial accounting and managerial economics with an emphasis on decentralisation, the structure of responsibility centres within firms, internal pricing, managerial performance evaluation and executive compensation. His theoretical framework in these areas relies on tools from the economics of information. In particular he uses mechanism design theory to compare the efficiency of alternative organisational structures and reporting systems within firms. Part of his applied research has covered incentive provisions for sole source government contracts, learning by doing and cost dynamics in the semiconductor industry, and implementa-

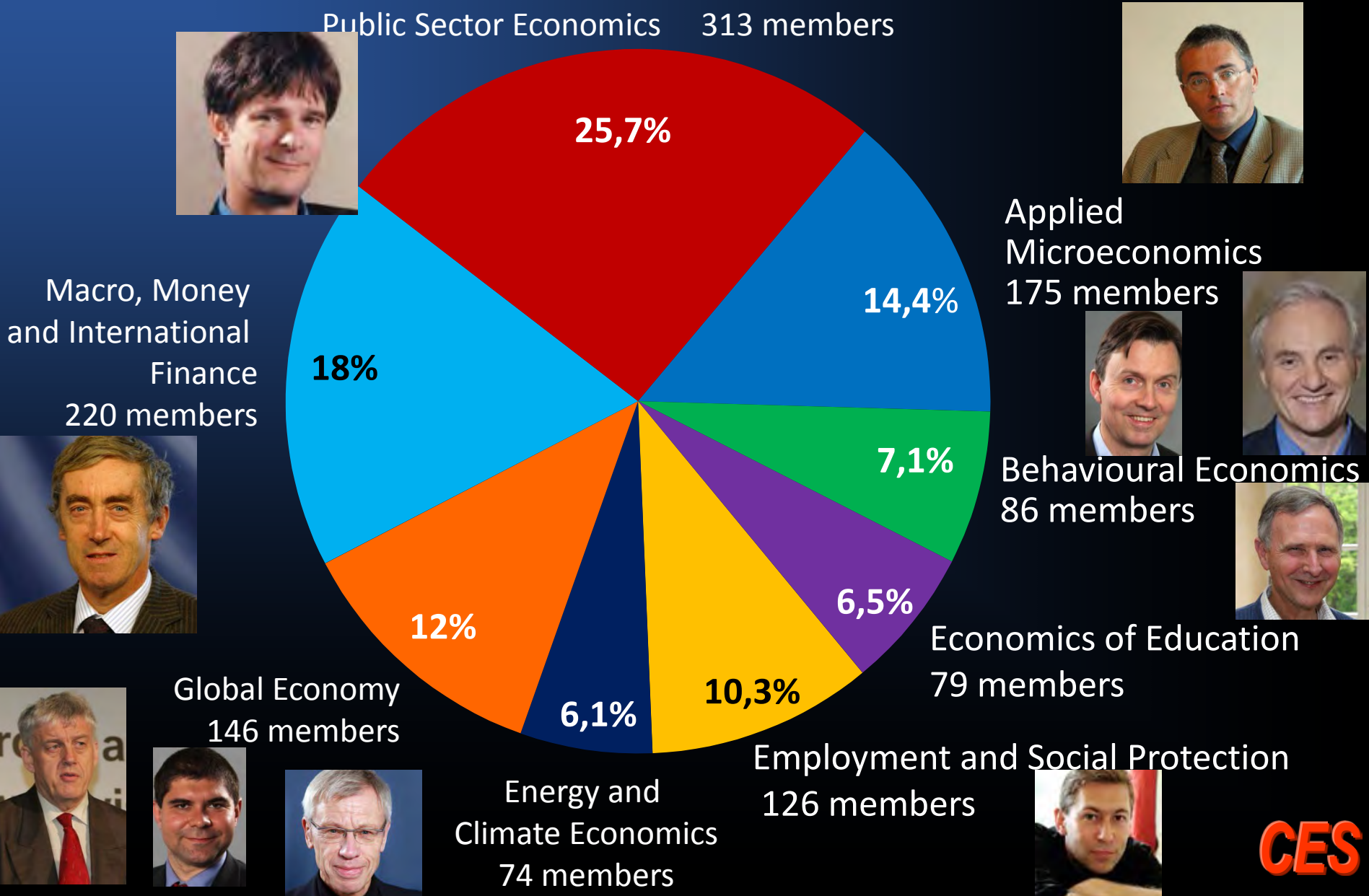
